We have more than 10 subjects being taught in our class but I chose 8 of them and these are English, Mathematics, Agriculture, Biology, Chichewa, Life Skills, Physics and Chemistry. During final tests of form 4 I scored distinctions in the first 4 mentioned subjects and credits in the rest of the subjects. I always work hard because I would like to achieve my goals.

I like sciences and would like to study at university/college in any faculty of science. I would like to become a doctor or laboratory expert.

I am dreaming of becoming a doctor or lab tech so that I can help the sick people. Living health is the only life I like mostly.

I come from the family where my parents can not manage to provide money to support my studies. They are all jobless. Even after writing the MSCE examinations and pass my parents will not be able to pay school fees for me to go for college education because fees for college studies are very expensive. In the past 3 years and 1 last term of my secondary school my school fees and all school materials have been paid by our church pastor who passed on last month just soon after the commencement of this 2nd term. There is no one to pay my fees, I am very concerned and weeping. Its therefore my humble plea for your kind consideration if possible. Please help me. I promise to continue working extra hard for the good results. I would like to be employed and develop my community after my studies.

I am a hard-working youth, at home I always like working in the garden slashing and sweeping the house surrounding.

I also like reading, watching football, singing and dancing.

At church I am one of the youth choir members.
